Bonato Named Provost for St. Peter's University

Saint Peter's University announced that Frederick Bonato, Ph.D., has been appointed to the position of provost and vice president for academic affairs. Dr. Bonato most recently



served as the associate provost for academic affairs at Mont-clair State University in Montclair, NJ, where he provided oversight for academic personnel procedures for more than 600 full-time faculty and assisted and advised on policy issues related to personnel matters, staffing, and enrollment patterns.

During his tenure at Montclair State University, Dr. Bonato had numerous accomplishments, in-

cluding, co-leading a project for the creation of the School of Nursing. He also provided leadership for the development of the 25,000 square foot Center for Clinical Services that opened in January 2016. In addition, Dr. Bonato oversaw the modernization of electronic systems for the Institutional Review Board, Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, and Career Services. He also chaired the task force that resulted in the Carnegie Foundation classification as a Community Engaged Institution in 2015 as well as initiated the transition of the Office of Service Learning to the Center for Community Engagement, which now receives approximately 1 million dollars a year in external funding.

During his time at Saint Peter's, Dr. Bonato served as a faculty member, director of faculty research and sponsored program, senate president and chair of the psychology department. Prior to that, he was an assistant professor at Upsala College. He is the immediate past-president of the Eastern Psychological Association and is the editor-in-chief of *Aerospace Medicine and Human Performance*, the official journal of the Aerospace Medical Association. He has published widely on aeromedical topics such as motion sickness, space motion sickness, and commercial spaceflight. He is a fellow of the Eastern Psychological Association and the Aerospace Medical Association and in 2015 was nominated and elected to the International Academy for Aviation and Space Medicine. He earned his B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. from Rutgers University.

NIOSH Highlights 10 Years of Occupational Safety and Health Research

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) is highlighting 10 years of occupational safety and health research in a new publication, "National Occupational Research Agenda: Second Decade in Review, 2006-2016," a report of the activities, effectiveness, outcomes, and impacts of a decade of work by NIOSH and their partners in the National Occupational Research Agenda (NORA). The report outlines the progress and impact made in addressing occupational safety and health research needs over the second decade of NORA. During this decade, the focus of NORA was on moving research into practice in the workplace, with an emphasis around 10 industry sectors. This report highlights the work of NIOSH and their partners in achieving this impact. In addition to the main report, the "Sector and Cross Sector Program Supplement" report provides program-specific results on the work of each of the 10 NORA sectors and 24 cross-sector programs, which were developed by NIOSH to support the NORA sector program goals and objectives.

Mayo Clinic Researchers Discover New Prostate Cancer Biomarkers

Mayo Clinic researchers have identified a new cause of treatment resistance in prostate cancer which also suggests ways to improve the therapy. The findings appear in *Nature Medicine*. In the article, the authors explain the role of mutations within the SPOP gene on the development of resistance to one class of drugs. These mutations play a central role in the development of resistance to drugs called BETinhibitors. As a therapy, BET-inhibitors are promising, but drug resistance often develops. Prostate cancer is among the most diagnosed malignancies in the United States, and is also the third leading cause of cancer death in American men, according to the American Cancer Society. Because of this, improving treatments for prostate cancer is an important public health goal. In the publication, the authors report SPOP mutations stabilize BET proteins against the action of BET-inhibitors. By this action, the mutations also promote cancer cell proliferation, invasion, and survival. These findings are important because SPOP mutation or elevated BET protein expression can now be used as biomarkers to improve the outcome of BET inhibitor-oriented therapy of prostate cancer with SPOP mutation or BET protein overexpression.
